#### **Directions:**

From west and S/W Houston, take 59 downtown, exit for Richmond. After taking exit, stay on right and go down ramp to lights on Richmond. Turn left at lights; continue along Richmond to lights at Montrose, right turn (north).

#### THE HYDROGRAPHIC SOCIETY: MEMBERSHIPS AND MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Membership in The Hydrographic Society is open to any individual or organization with an interest in surveying afloat. No formal qualifications are required. The membership period is from January 1 through December 31.

The Hydrographic Society United States (HSUS) is the former US Branch of The Hydrographic Society (THS) that was founded in 1972 at the Northeast London Polytechnic in London, England. Effective December 31, 2002, THS devolved into five autonomous "National Societies" under the "Federation of Hydrographic Societies". Dues in HSUS are currently set at \$20 which includes four issues of The Hydrographic Journal, the annual Diary and the reduced admission to the annual "Hydro Conference" (not to be confused with "US Hydro"). There is no formal relationship between HSUS and THSOA, although several members are officers in both. For further information contact the Secretary/Treasurer, Karl Kieninger Hydromarine@compuserve.com.

The Hydrographic Society of America (THSOA) serves as the focal point for activities in the Americas. Members of THSOA receive the Seahorse Newsletter (3 issues per year) and a subscription to Hydro International Magazine (10 issues per year), which includes the annual Sourcebook. Members are eligible for membership in local chapters, and receive a discount on registration at THSOA sponsored events. There are local chapters in Houston (TX), Pacific Northwest (Portland and Seattle), and Bay St. Louis (MS).

The Houston Chapter of The Hydrographic Society of America (THSOAHC) serves Houston, Texas, and surrounding areas; providing local meetings on a regular monthly basis, a *THSOA, Houston Chapter Newsletter* on events of local interest, and social activities for its members and the members of the Student Chapter of THSOA at Texas A&M Galveston AND Corpus Christi.

<u>CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP (THSOA) \$125</u> provides members with a free link to their company web page, free recruitment notices on the web site and membership in the local Houston Chapter. Each THSOA corporate member is able to list two, and only two, 'Corporate Member Representatives' who are deemed nominated members of THSOA and the Houston Chapter with the same benefits as Individual Membership without Individual Membership registration. These THSOA memberships include no direct THS (international) benefits or memberships.

THSOA INDIVIDUAL MEMBERSHIPS, including reduced RETIRED & STUDENT Rates: these THSOA members receive the *Seahorse* Newsletter (3 issues per year), a subscription to Hydro International Magazine (10 issues per year), which includes the annual Sourcebook, and discounted registration at THSOA sponsored events and seminars. Membership in THSOA (not through Houston Chapter) for Individual Members does not automatically include local chapter membership, — separate local dues of \$15 are required. Retired & Student THSOA rates include gratis Houston Chapter membership.

**HOUSTON CHAPTER (THSOA-HC) MEMBERSHIP**: Members of the Houston chapter of THSOA are invited to attend local monthly meetings, receive a copy of the *THSOA, Houston Chapter Newsletter,* and are invited to attend social events of the Houston Chapter. While non-members are encouraged to visit the Houston Chapter meetings, persons attending on a regular basis are encouraged to join THSOA in support of the chapter's efforts on behalf of the local hydrographic community. **There is no longer a local Houston chapter only membership level, since Houston Chapter members are required to be members of THSOA.** Local chapter membership is included in THSOA membership rates shown on the other page of this form.
